#### Introduction

A study of the structure and characteristics of population is an important aspect of study of population. The study of the structure an characteristics of population which is also known as the study of the composition of population. It covers aspect of population studies, which embraces the following basis, personal, social and economic characteristics or attributes of an population, age, sex, race, nationality, religion, language, marital status, household and family composition, literacy and educational attainment, employment status, occupation, income etc. these all characteristics helps to study population study for a small village to world level.

Data base and methodology:- The present paper is based on the census handbook 2011 and socio economic abstracts. Books and journal also referred for the study. Quantitative and analytical methodology is used for present work.

#### Study Area

Kalamb town is located on 180 34' 29" north latitude and 760 01' 18" east longitudes. Kalamb is a town with a Municipal Council in Osmanabad district in the Maharashtra. It is under the kalamb tahsil. Geographically kalamb town is situated on the bank of the Manjra river. Kalamb has an elevation of 647 meters. The total population of kalamb town is 25713 according to 2011 census

#### Population growth of kalamb town

Kalamb is a municipal council town in kalamb tahsil. Town is located under drought prone area of Osmanabad district. The total population of town is 25713 as per census 2011. Out of 13524 were males and 12189 were females population. The population growth of kalamb town was very rapid after independence. As per census data total population was 5396 in 1941, it rose in 1951 with 5802. In the year 1961 population decreased suddenly with 2297.after 1971 the population again increased and reached at 10216. In 2001 population growth continuously happened and reaches at 23022. The latest census report shows with 25713 populations. First time in 2011 town census marked 25 thousd.



- Caste wise population of kalamb town: population of kalamb town shows diverse caste structure.
- It includes SC, ST, and OBC category population. Scheduled caste total population constitutes 4021,
- out of 2121 were male and 1900 were female. The percentage share of SC population with total population is 15.6%.
- Scheduled tribe total population is 1118 out of 584 were male and 534 were female. Total ST
- Population is 4.3% among the total population. As compare to other city population kalamb has high ST population.
- Religion wise population:kalamb town is one of the diverse population structure in terms of religion. Town having population just 25713, but shares diverse religious composition of population.
- Town registered 18858 Hindu populations with 73.34% of total population. Out of 9959 male and
- 8899 were female population. Muslim community ranked second shared 5240 population with 20.387%. Out of 2710 were males and 2530 were females. Buddhist population ranked third with
- sharing 1090 population constitutes 4.24%. Out of 568 were male and 522 were female.
  - Christen population shared 65 with 0.25%. Out of 30 male and 35 were female. Jain community

also registered 381 population constitutes 1.48%. Out of 206 were male and 175 were female. Sikh, other religion and no religion specified category shows 10, 14, and 55 respectively.

Literacy pattern of kalamb town:- the literacy rate of town is 85.53% in 2011 which is higher than average literacy rate of Maharashtra of 82.34%. Out of total population 10624 male were literate and 8344 female were. As compare to other town male literacy is higher than female literacy.



Sex ratio of the town:- as compare to Indias sex ratio kalamb sex ratio is lower with 901. There are 901 females per thousand males. The child sex ratio is also lower i.e. 808. It is lower than the kalamb town sex ratio.

Working population of kalamb town: - economic composition of town is very poor. Out of total population 76.9+0 were main workers. In this main workers male shared higher percentage than female. Cultivators are also present in this town shared 583 population. Agricultural labors shared 733 populations. In this category male population is dominant over female population. Household industry

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workers are very low with only 215. Other workers shares about 6159 population out of 5064 were male. Marginal workers are also above the 1000. Non working population shares 17010.
